#### DOVENBY HOUSE



1 COUNCIL PLACE

This historic weatherboard house was relocated, just after the turn of the 21st century before being renovated to its current state of splendor.





One of a group of public buildings (with the "Police Station" & "Post Office") built between 1899 & 1902. This is the civic heart of the Town of East Fremantle.



### FMR POLICE STATION



3 133 CANNING HWY

A Federation bungalow, Rustic with Georgian Influences, which retains most of its external detail. Two brick cells are still located at the rear of the building.

5 15 RIVERSIDE DRIVE

**CARROLLS** 

HOUSE

This land was purchased by the Carrolls' in 1889, with the building colloquially known as 'The Boat Builders House'. Now the home of The Left Bank.




## FMR PLYMPTON HOTEL



59 CANNING HIGHWAY

Built in 1909, with a recent refurbishment offering visitors 360° views of Fremantle, East Fremantle & the Swan River from the Tradewinds Hotel Rooftop Terrace.



#### GLANVILLE BUILDING



7 34 TO 36 CANNING HIGHWAY

This Hitchcock designed building was built in 1902 for Mr Henry Charles Glanville, a Fremantle chemist. It is the only known three-storey example of his architecture in WA.



#### ANGWIN House



8 3 GLYDE STREET

A Federation Bungalow style built by Mr William Angwin JP MLA in 1909, a beautifully symmetrical home featuring a full width bullnosed verandah.



## FMR METHODIST CHURCH



9 8 GLYDE STREET

Constructed using Rottnest limestone, boasting Romanesque arches. Much of the exterior & interior remains, including Karri floorboards.






This finely designed two storey Federation

Classical style building provides a visual focal

point for the Town with strong aesthetic value.



Comprises a corner shop & 7 terrace residences with distinctive tall capped chimneys. The street's namesake, George Pearse, arrived in WA in 1829.





11 44 HUBBLE STREET

One is in a Federation style (Hubble), with Gothic influences whilst the other is Late Victorian / Early Federation (Sewell).

## KING STREET TERRACE



46 TO 52 KING STREET

4 single-storey terraced houses in the "Italianate" style. Each is named after a gold-rush town in Victoria.



### ROYAL GEORGE HOTEL



15 34 DUKE STREET

Built in 1885, a two-storey Federation Free Classical style corner hotel building with the cupola being a rare example still in its original form.



# SWAN BRUSH FACTORY



16 36 TO 42 DUKE STREET

This new factory for the WA Brushware Co started life in 1907. In 2018 the newly renovated premises re-opened, featuring the Duke of George jazz bar.

17 STIRLING HIGHWAY IMPACT

The 80s highway extension split Duke Street. St Peters Road was named after the Anglican Church which previously stood on the corner.



HAMILTON STREET



18 37 HAMILTON STREET

Federation style, Regency influences A wonderfully original house, with a significant expansion, which retains its form & details.



LOCKE PARK ROTUNDA



19 CNR FLETCHER & MOSS STREETS

4 Washington Palms stand sentry around the Federation Rotunda, within the geometrically laid out Locke Park.
