Town Of East Fremantle 2017 in Review

Message from the Mayor

Another year is quickly coming to a close and the Town has again had a very busy and productive year. A number of key projects have been undertaken this year, including the refurbishment of the interior of the Town Hall which is due for completion early in the New Year. Work is on schedule for the refurbishment of office space, the Council Chamber and meeting areas on the first floor. Needed upgrades to the building include a lift to the Council Chamber area, for disabled access; a new front reception and meeting room area; security; upgraded toilet facilities and contemporary work stations as well as much needed structural improvements. I know that our staff are looking forward to moving back to their new accommodation and Council is also eager to be able to make better use of the Chamber and meeting spaces. It is envisaged that the Council Chambers will be available for community use.

Stage one of the much-needed foreshore works at John Tonkin Park have been completed. Four headlands have been installed to dissipate wave energy, reducing erosion of the beaches with the intention of stabilising the foreshore area, including trees and native plantings and protecting the beach. The foreshore at John Tonkin Park experiences significant erosion and as one of the most used sections of the Swan River, it has been imperative that work be undertaken there. It is important that we continue to maximise the amenity for all users whilst ensuring sound environmental protection to the flora.

Early in the New Year additional works at John Tonkin Park will commence in the form of a new interpretation node that celebrates the history of the foreshore in East Fremantle.

Another milestone this year was the major review of our Strategic Community Plan - 2017-2027, which was adopted following our community engagement and consultation process. This year for the first time, the Town hosted a Business Breakfast with 30 people

representing 18 businesses attending. The Town has plans for further initiatives with the business community in the coming months, details of which will be circulated via mailing lists, our website, e-Newsletter and Facebook page. If you are not currently receiving our e-Newsletter email I encourage you to sign up via our website. Alternatively if you do not have access to email, phone the Town administration office and we will arrange for a hard copy to be posted each month.

Council also adopted its first Public Art Strategy which aims to ensure the Town develops public art to assist in creating places that are valued by the community and visitors, and relate clearly to the identity of East Fremantle. A copy of the Strategy is available on our website, along with the Strategic Community Plan.

Christmas is a very special time for family and friends to get together and reflect on the year gone by. It is a time to celebrate the coming year with hope and enthusiasm and is an opportunity to be thankful for what we have and support those who are less fortunate. This year I invite you to reconnect with the meaning of Christmas

and reach out a little further to those around us. On behalf of the Council and staff at the Town of East Fremantle, I wish you all a very Merry Christmas and safe and Happy New Year.
