Oval Precinct Project Actively Engages Community on All Sides

Not only did the Town recently host two drop-in information sessions where residents and interested community members heard first-hand from the design and delivery team about the latest design elements of this project, this design really does engage the community on all sides.

"This is a building very much shaped by the activity around it with activated edges for the community to enjoy on all sides," explained

CEO Gary Tuffin. The concept imagery of the landscape design includes a dog exercise area, skate and basketball zone and native play area, plus natural landscaping features the inclusion of many endemic trees providing shade, biodiversity and amenity. The second concept imagery shows the northern arrival with the "wayfinding" leading past the café on the left and playground on the right. All going to plan, construction is expected to commence in September.

Nothing Wasted at 2021 George Street Festival – Town Wins 2022 Waste Avoidance (Events) Award

At last month's WasteSorted Awards, the Town of East Fremantle won the Waste Avoidance (Events) Award for the 2021 George Street Festival. Accepting the award on behalf of the Town was Mayor Jim O'Neill, alongside Connor, Waste & Sustainability Officer and Carly, Community Engagement Officer and festival organiser.

'In East Fremantle we are very proud to have significantly minimised the waste at our Festival, setting a new path for best practice for sustainable large-scale events, as well as new records in relation to waste minimisation,' Mayor O'Neill explained.

The Town has been running East Fremantle's George Street Festival since 1989 and last year the festival successfully banned single-use plastics from all areas of the festival and instead opted for reusable alternatives, providing over 20,000 reusable items to



all food and beverage vendors. With over 10,000 attendees eating and drinking over the seven-hour duration of the festival, only 146.6 kilograms of waste was produced, 48 kilograms of waste was sent to landfill with 98 kilograms of waste being recovered.

With 104 nominations across 10 categories, the Town is thrilled to be recognised for this award and aims to use the Event as a case study for other local governments and event organisers on how to implement reusables and a FOGO bin system to successfully avoid waste at events.



Introducing our Know Thy Neighbour #3 Artist, Yabini Kickett

Yabini Kickett (Esther McDowell) is a descendant of the Kickett and Hayden families of the Bibulmun/Noongar Nation.

Having grown up with an artist and poet mother, as well as a photographer and land conservationist father, her practice is heavily rooted in language, endemic plants, family, totemic relations and found objects from country. In late 2017 Yabini participated in the National Indigenous Arts Leadership program at the National Gallery, this experience helped foster lasting relationships and deeply encouraged her to pursue working within Visual Arts. Currently Yabini is experimenting with textiles, and found objects, with a focus on animal remains from hunting and roadkill. The resulting works are often about place and the solastalgia associated with the destruction of country.

Yabini's intentions are to leverage the Town's proximity to the coast to help draw other's attention to the smaller things in our surroundings. This will be an opportunity to connect with the community in East Fremantle, specifically Richmond Primary School, and encourage them to consider their local environments, how they looked in the past and where they are now.
