Pipe renewal for East Fremantle

Water Corporation will soon be renewing water pipes in East Fremantle. Around three kilometres of pipe will be installed along Fraser Street, Petra Street, Fletcher Street, Moss Street, George Street, Silas Street, St Peter Road and Sewell Street. There will also be work completed on the corner of Preston Point Road, Staton Road and Alexandra Road. Construction work is planned to begin in mid-2021 and will take around ten months to complete. East Fremantle Oval Business Case – Have Your Say

The Town of East Fremantle intends to undertake the redevelopment of the East Fremantle Oval Precinct. Following the announcement of a \$20 million funding commitment by both political parties, the Town is progressing with this project as a priority. The project qualifies as a major land transaction, and therefore a business plan has been prepared. Easter Tips

To reduce your waste why not make your own Easter eggs and hot cross buns? If you bought Easter eggs/bunnies/bilbys come in cardboard, they can go in the recycling. The 'scrunchable' plastic that eggs sometimes come in can be placed in your red-lidded general waste bin or returned to REDcycle at participating Coles and Woolworths. The clean foil wrapping can also go in your recycling bin. Changes to bin collection for the Easter Long Weekend. Please note that bins that would normally be collected on Friday 2 April will be collected the following day. All other services will be as normal.



Bulk Waste

The next round of Council's bulk waste collection, which this time will be green waste, begins on Monday 8 March 2021. Please place your waste on the verge by 6am Monday as the contractor will only service your verge for Green Waste once.

Advice on what you can put on your verge for this collection is available at our website and in your waste calendar.

Note: Council's next bulk waste for these items is scheduled to begin on 11 October 2021.

Strategic Community Plan 2020 – 2030 – See Our New Vision

The East Fremantle community expressed its support for Council's future vision and priorities, with a stronger emphasis being placed on sustainable growth in the Strategic Community Plan 2020-2030. In refining the SCP, the Town conducted extensive community consultation, doubling the number of community members who participated in the last review in 2017. Overall, it was revealed that the community has confidence in the Town's leadership and its current priorities and generally agrees that the administration is delivering on its objectives. When asked if the Town's existing vision was still current, support was expressed for refining the vision to become: "Inclusive community and lifestyle, balancing growth and sustainability." Request a Verge Tree

Verge trees help to create ecosystems that provide habitat and food for birds and other animals. Verge trees provide shade for pedestrians, improve the appearance of our streets and create corridors between natural areas for wildlife. Tree-lined streets can also increase property values, reduce cooling costs and improve the overall health of our communities.

If you are interested in having a verge tree installed at your property this year, please contact the Town at admin@eastfremantle.wa.gov.au To coincide with planting season, requests should be received by the end of May 2021. Town Adopts New Guide to Urban Style

The Town of East Fremantle's iconic and eclectic look and feel has been formalised and will be preserved thanks to its **Urban Streetscape and Public Realm Style Guide** adopted in December 2020. Its purpose is to provide:

Consistency - consistent style and design palette for future works to the public realm and streetscape.

Character - design guidelines that enhance and celebrate the Town's unique character, recognising and responding to identified areas or precincts of a similar nature.

Safety and Comfort - create comfortable and safe places for people to use which encourage walking, cycling and use of public transport.

Quality - provide clear guidance to those involved in designing and constructing public realm spaces on the quality of design expected.

To support the Guide, pamphlets were created for each of the Town's distinct precincts:

- Plympton
- Woodside
- Richmond
- Richmond Hill
- Riverside
- Town Centre
- Raceway
